Checklist for Groups to Conduct a Group Conscience for Fellowship Voting

This checklist is designed to guide ACA groups through the process of conducting a Group Conscience for Fellowship Voting (FGV). It is based on a video that demonstrates how to take a group conscience and vote, following ACA principles and The Traditions. Please be sure to share this document with your group to help members work in cooperation and unity. Consider keeping a record of your proceedings for your group archives.

	Tradition One: Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on ACA unity.
]	Meditation: Higher Power. I am your trusted servant seeking to support my ACA group and its primary purpose. Please remind me that the life of my program and my own recovery depends upon my willingness to put the group's welfare above my own will. Help me recognize unity.
]	Tradition Two: For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority – a loving God as expressed in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
\$ 1 1 2 5	Meditation: Higher Power. I understand that you make your voice heard in a group conscience. I ask you to remind me that the life of my program and, therefore, my own recovery depends upon my willingness to put the group's welfare above my own will. Where I disagree with the common view of my fellows in service, allow me to state my case honestly and respectfully. Allow me to listen to and consider the views of others. May I state my view and support all group decisions, including the ones I might disagree with. Your will, not mine, be done.
	Concept I: The final responsibility and the ultimate authority for ACA World Services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole fellowship.

-	hat the decision-making process is spiritual, cooperative, and guided by a ligher Power.

Procedural Options

☐ Determine whether the group will use simple majority or substantial unanimity (2/3 or 66.7%) for decision-making. The group also determines if the chair of the meeting can have a voice and vote; the chair needs to ensure they are not influencing the group and could be the last share.	g
☐ Someone makes a motion about one of the choices and the chair asks for a second to that motion.	
☐ Have a group discussion where members can speak in favor of or against th motion.	9
☐ Take the vote on which decision-making method to use. Count and record the votes for, against, and abstentions.	
☐ Invite anyone who voted in the minority to give a minority opinion(s) after the initial vote if they wish. Allow up to two members from the minority to share briefly. When asking for minority opinions, the chair might ask them t share something that hasn't already been said that they would like others to consider.	
Ask if anyone would like to change their vote, based on having heard the minority opinion. If so, take a revote. No additional minority opinion is hear after a revote.	d
☐ Decide on time limits for member sharing (for example, two minutes per share) to allow everyone an opportunity to speak before anyone shares a second time.	
\square Select a timekeeper to gently remind members when their time is complete.	
Discussion	
☐ Proceed to discussion of the Fellowship Voting issue (motion).	
Members share in turn, guided by the principles of neutrality, open-mindedness, inclusion, and service.	
☐ Ensure everyone who wishes to share has spoken once before any member shares again.	
Voting	
☐ When discussion is complete, take the group vote on the Fellowship issue (Yes, No, or Abstain). Record all votes clearly.	
Invite minority opinions, as explained earlier (only those who voted in the minority may share).	

		If any member wishes to change their vote after hearing the minority opinion, conduct a revote.	
		Confirm and record the final decision of the group conscience.	
		Designate one Trusted Servant to input the group's vote and comments into the WS voting system.	50
